Compact PA Speaker to Debut in '96

Between the time the original Low B-2 system was introduced (late '93) and now, it has gained a certain acceptance as a PA speaker. In fact, it has a wider range, with higher output and lower distortion than virtually any PA speaker of its size!



Some users have forcefully suggested to our founder and chief executive officer, Sneed Hearn, that people who use this speaker for synthesized duos and acoustic instruments may not need bone-crushing bass, but still could benefit from a clean, wide range, compact speaker. Acoustic bass players would, of course, be thrilled to have a very small speaker which could faithfully reproduce the complex overtones of this difficult instrument.
